Domaine Lebreuil

Aloxe-Corton Boutières

MR: Muscle of a very refined kind: elegance, subtlety, and pure fruit. A tight structure and an enormous finish. Terrific. $\underline{\mathbf{18}}$

Savigny-lès-Beaune Aux Grands Liards

MR: Creamy and closed—unusually so for a Savigny at this age. But the finish is long. More tannin than fruit showing at the moment, but it's not bottled yet. A distinguished wine. <u>15</u>

Savigny-lès-Beaune Premier Cru Peuillets

MR: Fifty-year-old vines here have given a wine of lovely depth and silkiness; a serious Savigny. Very good indeed; sleek, pure, very long. <u>17</u>

Savigny-lès-Beaune Premier Cru Serpentières

MR: Huge depth—the vines were planted in 1924—a very confident, sleek wine, with lovely pure Pinot fruit; long, delicious, restrained, and powerful; lovely aromatics. <u>17.5</u>

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
