The 2017 Mercurey Blanc is showing very well, bursting with notes of crisp green orchard fruit, peach pit and honeysuckle that are delicately framed by a touch of oak. On the palate, the wine is medium to full-bodied, with a satiny attack, a fleshy core and succulent acids. This pretty Mercurey is one of the best white wines I've tasted from Domaine du Meix Foulot.

As I wrote last year, Agnès de Launay presides over this important 20-hectare estate in Mercurey, which boasts an enviable palate of premiers crus that includes a monopole, the 1.9-hectare Clos du Château de Montaigu, a wine that is typically simultaneously the most complex, elegant and complete of all the domaine's reds. For the time being, farming is conventional. The 2017 vintage is a great success at this address, the inherent suppleness and charm of the vintage seemingly synergizing with the domaine's style, tempering tannins but not at the expense of fruit and flesh.
